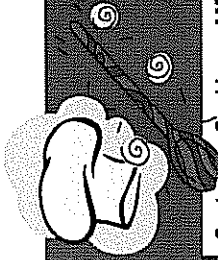

Session I June 13—June 17

Costa Rica Cooking—AM (9:00-11:15)
Grades: Rising 6th—up

Let's cook Costa Rican food! You will learn how to prepare rice, beans and five different main dishes from Costa Rica. We will be preparing five meals typical of Costa Rica such as: Arroz con pollo, Picadillo de chayote, Olla de carne, Chirrasquillas, and Gallo pinto.

Creative Writing—AM (9:00-11:15)

This workshop will introduce students to the stylistic and thematic elements of fiction throughout the close reading and analysis of published works by a diverse range of authors. Students will participate in in-class writing exercises and will be asked to turn in short written exercises, poetry, and one completed short story. Students will critique each others work and gain valuable feedback on their writing in a workshop style setting. Students will also have the opportunity to meet one on one with the instructor to gain insight on the revision process.

Let's Learn to Fly RC (radio controlled flights)—AM (9:00-11:15)

Students will learn to fly a basic RC trainer while exploring the basics of flight! As a group the novice pilots will learn to use a flight simulator program and graduate to flying a basic RC trainer. The basics of take off, landings, and simple aerobatics will be covered. Our flying will be done with an electric trainer but students will also be taught the basics of flying with 2 stroke gas engines and their proper maintenance.

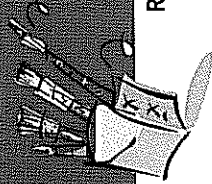

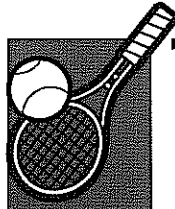
Outdoor Garden Art—PM (12:45-3:00)

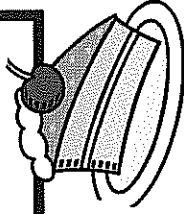

There is a one time, non-refundable registration fee of \$5 per student.



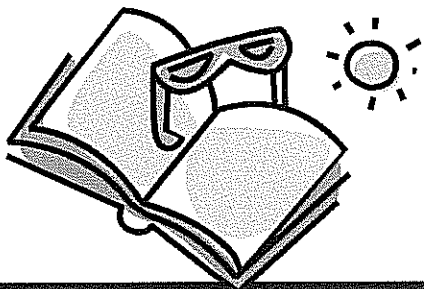
